Spring Recess March 1 - 9

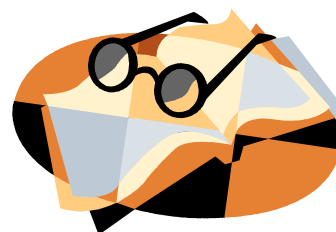
In spite of the cold weather, Spring Break is almost here! The law library will observe the following hours during the Spring Recess.

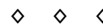
