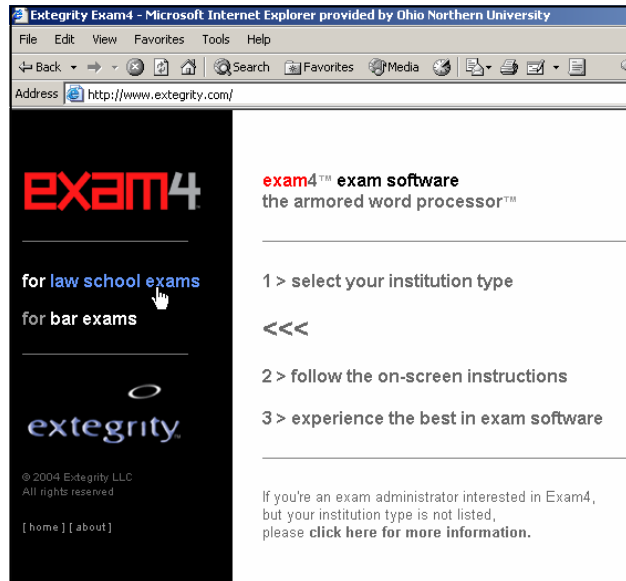
Signs are posted throughout the library as a reminder of the need for quiet in all areas. Thank you for your cooperation.

Don't Forget to Download Exam Software!

If you are planning on using your computer to take final exams, don't forget to download the Extegrity Exam4 exam software. Even if you used this software for fall semester exams, you will still need to download the latest version before you take exams this semester.

The download and installation process is very easy. Just follow these steps:

- Go to <http://www.extegritty.com/>
- Click on "for law school exams" in the left-hand frame
- Click on "law students > click here to register and download"
- Find "ONU Pettit College of Law" on the list of law schools provided and click on it
- Enter your name and e-mail address and then click the button to submit the form and go to the download page



- If you select "Open/Run" from the download pop-up, the software will install or re-install automatically. If you select "Save," find the downloaded file on your hard drive (Exam40-pettit.exe) and then double-click it to begin the installation process. If you are asked whether or not to overwrite existing files, click "Yes."

If you have any problems with installing the software or need to ask any questions, please stop by Larry Baumgardner's office for help.
