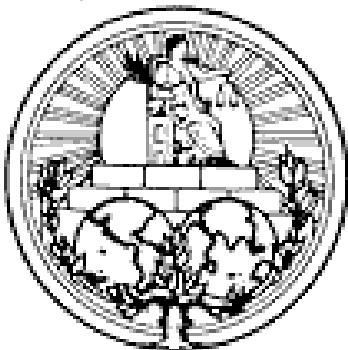




ONU to Host Jessup Regional Moot Court Competition

During the weekend of February 25-27, the Pettit College of Law will be hosting the Central Regional of the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition.



Eleven teams will come to ONU to participate in the three-day event. The winner of the regional will join teams from across the United States and around the world at the Shearman & Sterling International Rounds, held in Washington, D.C. at the end of March.

The Jessup Competition, the oldest and largest international law moot court competition, was started in 1959 by a group of students from Harvard, Columbia, and the University of Virginia.

While the first competition consisted of only two teams, both from Harvard, last year's competition featured teams from 539 different law schools representing 83 different countries.

This year's Jessup problem involves a dispute between two countries over a commercial shipping vessel, its crew, and its cargo after the vessel runs aground as the result of a pirate attack. The problem deals with maritime and environmental law issues.

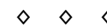

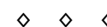

USSC+ Provides Access to Supreme Court Cases

The library is proud to announce the recent addition of the USSC+ Database of U.S. Supreme Court Opinions. This easy-to-use database contains over 25,000 full-text Supreme Court opinions, including complete coverage from 1855 to the present.

While the opinions can be searched by citation, party name, or keyword, a key feature of USSC+ is its unique 2,800-term subject index. This gives the researcher one-click access to all the Supreme Court cases dealing with a narrow topic, such as the death penalty or voting rights.

The USSC+ Database can be accessed through the Internet Subscription Services page on the library's website, or by going to www.uscplus.com.
