



## Fall Semester is Drawing to a Close

We've all had a busy fall semester! The library has been very busy with students doing research and the library staff has been involved in a number of activities designed to support the research needs of the law school community.



In early September, the librarians offered library tours to first-year students to familiarize them with the print sources that they would be using during the fall semester. About 80 first-year students attended these tours.

The Law Library offered nearly 70 legal research workshops this fall. This annual workshop series helps to reinforce the first-year legal research and writing program. Workshop topics included case law, statutes and legislative history, administrative law, and secondary sources. The final workshop sessions served as a review of all the resources used during the semester in preparation for the first-year legal research exam at the end of October.

The reference desk has also been busy throughout the semester. Students have had a variety of questions involving legal research and writing assignments, the annual federal tax research assignment, and law review source and cite checks, to name just a few.
