New Electronic Resources

The Law Library is pleased to announce that we have recently obtained subscriptions to two electronic databases, **LLMC Digital** and **Early American Imprints, Evans Digital Edition**, to assist you with your research needs. Both of these databases can be accessed by clicking on the "Library and Research" link on the law school's home page (<http://www.law.onu.edu>), then clicking on the "Internet Subscription Resources" link.

LLMC Digital contains digital reproductions of over 3,000,000 pages of government document collections, including Board of Land Appeals Decisions, Patent and Trademark Law Committee Reports, and the Supreme Court Journal, to name a few.

An example of the documents available through LLMC is the image to the right, which is taken from the Reports of the Subversive Activities Control Board of the 1950s.



Early American Imprints, Evans Digital Edition currently has over 2,000,000 digital page images from American texts produced between 1639-1800. It is one of the most definitive resources for historical information about almost every aspect of life in early America.

One example is the image to the left, a page from the court-martial proceedings of Colonel David Henley held in Massachusetts in 1778.
