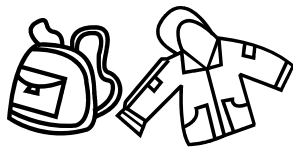

Now Available: Link to Electronic Journals from POLAR

Have you ever wondered if you can find a particular journal on Lexis, Westlaw, OhioLINK, or some other electronic database? You can now identify and access the library's holdings for electronic titles, such as journals, newspapers, and other periodicals, from POLAR, our online library catalog. This feature is possible thanks to a new enhancement called Serials Solutions Electronic Resource Management System (ERMS).

To see what Serials Solutions can do, first search for a serial title, such as the *Harvard Law Review*. You can then click on "Online: Serials Solutions" to show the online
