Workshop sign-up sheets are available on a table near the library entrance, so don't miss these opportunities to brush up on your legal research skills!

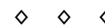

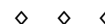

Where in the World is...?

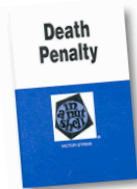
In response to recent requests, the library has recently ordered three updated atlases: the *Times Comprehensive Atlas of the World*; the *National Geographic World Atlas of the World*; and the *Oxford Atlas of the World*.

Did You Know...



The library has popular study aids, including Nutshells, Hornbooks, the Lexis *Understanding Series*, and Aspen's *Examples and Explanations Series*, available on almost every legal subject imaginable.



To find them, try keyword searches in POLAR using the name of your subject and the type of book you want.



For example, in POLAR, choose to search by keyword and search for **"property and nutshell"** or **"contracts and hornbook"** or **"torts and understanding"** or **"evidence and examples and explanations"**
