### Summer Book Shift

As you walk through the library, you may notice that many of the books have moved since last spring! This summer, because we were running out of space to shelve books, we needed to undertake a massive book shift. Many outdated and lesser-used items were put in new compact shelving in the basement, and significant parts of the collection were rearranged.

These changes will create much needed space for future growth in the collection, and we hope that they will also make the collection easier to use.



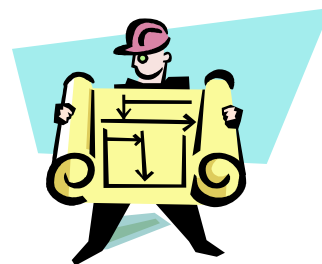
Some of the major changes in the book shift include:

- Consolidating all reporters in the National Reporter System on the south side of the library, so that multiple copies of the Federal Supplement, for example, are together
- Moving the treatises on the south side to the north side, so that call numbered treatises (A-Z) are together
- Putting all state materials (statutes, digests, encyclopedias, and treatises) together in the state section on the south side of the library. A handbook on evidence in Pennsylvania, for example, can now be found on the shelves right after the Pennsylvania statutes, Pennsylvania Digest, and the Pennsylvania Law Encyclopedia.

If you need help locating items in the library, please ask a library staff member.

### FYI: Space Changes in the Library

Over the summer, several construction projects took place that changed library space. The east end of the library hallway has been converted into the office suite for the new LL.M. program. Also, the new Willis Conference Room was created. The room is named in honor of ONU law graduate and professor Frank B. Willis, who also served as U.S. Congressman, Senator, and Governor of Ohio. This room will be used as a classroom and meeting room during the day, and will be available for group study at night. The Willis Room is accessible through a new door that is located on the library's south side near the reporters. We have also spruced up the group study rooms by adding new furniture.
