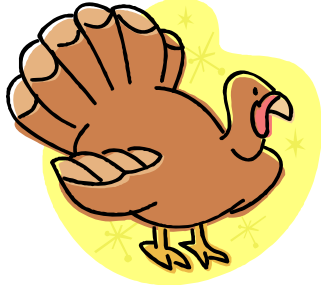

A Busy Fall in the Law Library

The fall semester is typically a busy time for everyone at the law school. This fall, the library staff has been involved in a number of activities to help support the research needs of the law school community.

In late August and early September, the librarians offered library tours to first-year students to familiarize them with the print sources that they would be using during the fall semester. More than 90 first-year students attended these tours. Support for upper-level seminar classes was also provided early in the semester through research guides and in-class presentations.



During September and October, the library offered over 80 legal research workshops. This annual workshop series helps to reinforce material taught in the first-year legal research and writing program. And, as usual, the reference desk has been busy throughout the semester with a wide variety of questions, including legal research and writing assignments, seminar papers, the annual federal tax research assignment, and law review source and cite checks, to name a few.

Early in November, a site inspection team from the ABA visited the law school and library. Throughout the summer and fall, the entire library staff wrote reports, compiled statistics, and organized the library to prepare for the inspection team.
