Library Construction Update

Library renovations are continuing this semester in preparation for the creation of the Hanson Reading Room this summer. Here are the latest construction updates:

- Lights were installed in the new microforms area last month. This project will be finished soon, with wood end panels being installed on the compact shelving units, all microfiche moved back into the cabinets, and the reader-printer machine moved into the new microforms room.
- The transformation of the old microforms room into the new technology center will begin either during spring break or sometime in the month of March. Please note that the current computer lab will not be moved until this summer.



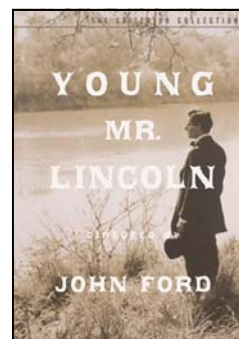
We will continue to try to minimize disruptions as these projects are being completed. Please let us know if you have any questions about the ongoing renovations.

More Additions to the Legal Movie Collection

The library's legal movie collection continues to grow. We have recently added the following movies (summaries taken from the library catalog):

***Young Mr. Lincoln* (1939):** This film presents a fictionalized account of ten years in the life of Abraham Lincoln, from a cabin in Kentucky to a law practice in Springfield, Illinois, before he was known to the nation and the world. Directed by John Ford and starring Henry Fonda.



***The Caine Mutiny* (1954):** During World War II, onboard a ship in the U.S. Pacific Fleet, an event occurs unlike any that the United States Navy has ever experienced. A ship's captain is removed from his command by his executive officer in an apparent outright act of mutiny. As the trial of the mutineers unfold, it comes to light that Captain Queeg was mentally unstable, perhaps even insane. The Navy must then decide if the Caine Mutiny is a criminal act or an act of courage to save a ship from destruction at the hands of her captain. Starring Humphrey Bogart, Jose Ferrer, Van Johnson, and Fred MacMurray.
